Jordan attended United States Marines Corps boot camp at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot in San Diego beginning in August 2014 and was part of Echo Company Platoon 2109, 2nd Training Battalion. He graduated Oct. 31 and in November attended Marine Combat Training (MCT) with India Company, 2nd Platoon. He then attended MOS training at Camp Le Jeune, N.C., in 2015.

Jordan was a private first class in the United States Marine Corps Reserves and was assigned to Truck Company, 23rd Marine Regiment, 4th Marine Division, out of Las Vegas.

His favorite pastime was playing and writing music. He excelled in playing the acoustic guitar. He also loved to listen to others' music that involved acoustic guitar, including his favorite, Coheed and Cambria. In school, the instruments he played included the flute, bassoon, electric bass and standup bass.

Jordan also loved to write songs and poetry and to study science, literature and history. He had planned to return to college to study theoretical physics.
