Latest on fatal on-air shootings released

MONETA, Va. (AP) — The latest on the fatal on-air shooting of two TV station employees in Virginia (all times local):

5:55 p.m.

The health insurer UnitedHealthcare says that the gunman in the fatal on-air shooting of two journalists worked as a call center employee in Virginia until November 2014.

UnitedHealthcare spokesman Matt Burns said Wednesday that Vester Flanagan started work at the center in Roanoke, Virginia, in September 2013.

WDBJ-TV has said Flanagan was fired from his reporting job there in 2013. He went by the name Bryce Williams on the air while a reporter there. Police say he shot reporter Alison Parker and cameraman Adam Ward on a live broadcast Wednesday morning. He later died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

5:35 p.m.

Police trucks are removing items from the apartment of the gunman in the fatal on-air shooting of two journalists.

The large apartment complex is in Roanoke, a few blocks from the station for WDBJ-TV, where Vester Flanagan once worked

with the reporter and cameraman authorities say he killed Wednesday morning. Hours later, Flanagan died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound.

A reporter knocked on the door Wednesday at midafternoon. No one answered. The area was quiet, with a few people there, including authorities and staff from the apartment complex. Two hours later, the area was bustling with police. On both visits, a reporter was asked to leave.

The apartment complex is near the highway and has a swimming pool, tennis courts and fitness center.

4:05 p.m.

A former co-worker of the man who shot and killed a TV reporter and cameraman during a live news broadcast says that Vester Flanagan was "off-kilter" and that he thought news anchoring was about "acting."

Olmstead became the Central Christian Church choir director in 2000, writing Christmas cantatas each year until he retired in 2014. He most recently is known for writing scripts for the Stage 4 Senior Readers Theatre.

Nancy Warren loves to sing harmony for anyone but says she particularly enjoys singing backup for Vic (Olmstead) and especially loves singing in her church's choir. She has been singing in choirs for many years. Warren often displays the gift of hospitality and is a generous community supporter. We are very excited to have use of her and Jay's beautiful cabin for this fundraising event.
