SC Theatre to present 'Much Ado About Nothing'

The cast and production crew have been announced for the upcoming Southwestern College theatre department presentation of William Shakespeare's "Much Ado About Nothing" Nov. 7 at 7:30 p.m.; Nov. 8, at 2 p.m.; and Nov. 12 and 13 at 7:30 p.m. All performances will be in the Richardson Performing Arts Center in the Christy Administration Building on the campus of Southwestern College.  
 Director Allyson Moon says this will be a contemporary version of this comedy. The dialogue will be Shakespearean, but the look and feel will be 2015.  
 "As the title 'Much Ado About Nothing' implies, the event that creates the great crisis of the play is not as real as it seems," says Moon. "The communication and miscommunication among the characters is very similar to today's social media driven world. We are so connected to our communication devices that a lot of meaningless and sometimes false information is made available for the world to see. That is exactly what happens in this play. And when the miscommunication occurs, the result is sometimes hilarious and sometimes nearly tragic, but the result is most entertaining."  
 Moon adds that the use of technology will be evi-

dent throughout the play. Most of the cast will be on stage with a cell phone. They will be taking selfies, and they will communicate via text message.  
 "We are going to project onto a screen what people are texting to each other. We want to be sure that the audience participates in the social media frenzy, too," Moon says.  
 The cast includes Justin Godwin as Don Pedro; Megan Morrow as Jenice; John Rohr as Claudio; Stephen Gehly as Benedick; Zoe Rea as Leonata; Krisha Baker as Antonia; Alex Wilken as Conrade; Jacob Marney as Borachio; Austin Davis as Father Francis; Eli Rodda as Sargent Dogberry; Sean Rethmeier and Donnie Dutton as officers; Emily Tilton as Detective Verges; Allie Petrovich as Hero; Tori Fairbank as Beatrice; and Anna Rosell as Margaret.
